Southill Alexander FC was founded this year – in fact, this is our very first season! This fledgling club is just embarking on its journey, and unlike our opponents, we have no illustrious history or honours to celebrate. Where this road will take us only time will tell, but we hope the future is exciting as our short past has been.

The club started as a dream amongst several people with a strong passion for football and the belief that the sport should belong 100% to the fans. This dream became a reality a few short months ago when Southill Alexander was formed. The journey has not been easy but it has always been fun and that was the whole intention when we established this club - to bring football back to the fans.

In these days of huge contracts in the Premiership, players earning more in a week than some clubs have to survive on in a year, fans being milked for every penny they have, we felt something had to change. Football is supposed to be fun, and that is what we hope to achieve with the Bishops.

Each match is another small step in moving this club forward and creating history. Win, lose or draw today the fact that Southill Alexander is actually on the

field playing a game of football is a major achievement in our eyes.

Our club is owned by its shareholders, who come from all parts of the world, and they chose our name, picked our colours and designed our badge.

“Southill” is of course a reference to the village of Southill, just around the corner from the Carlsberg stadium. “Alexander” is a nod to Bishop Alexander, also known as Alexander the Magnificent. He was the Bishop of Lincoln in the twelfth century and was granted the manor of Biggleswade by Henry 1st. Alexander gives us our nickname, “The Bishops”.

The purple kit reflects a Bishop’s purple robes – having chosen the colour, we were hard-pressed to find a kit manufacturer who could supply everything in the same shade! However, we are happy with the result and we think all the searching has been worth it.

Our badge reflects the elements of our name – the Bishop’s mitre and cross, with crossed crosiers, and the shield of Bedfordshire.

Finally our motto – some of us believe is that there is nothing greater than loyalty in adversity, in sport as in life. Hence “Loyalty Above All”. We are proud to see it on our players’ shirts today.

RENHOLD UNITED

The first known squad picture of Renhold United standing in front of the Three Horseshoes Renhold public house has the date 1922 stamped on it but no one seems to know anything about the players or team from that time. Renhold United was reformed in 1952 by Alf Duncome and Geoff Harlow with Alf being involved with the club for over 50 years. The first team and the reserves won division one and five in 1971/72 which was described by the Bedfordshire Times at the time as an unusual double in the Beds & District League. Renhold enjoyed success in the 1990's under the management of Mick Joswiak the last trophy being in 1998/99.

Evening all & a very special welcome to players, officials and supporters of Renhold United. We had a very good and closely fought game at Renhold back in September ending in a 2-2 draw. If I remember rightly we took a 2-0 lead before being pegged back by Renhold in the 2nd half. Only a last minute penalty saved from Tony Harvey on that occasion prevented us from throwing all three points away and that really so far has been the story of our inaugural season. Too many games have been thrown away by cheap sloppy mistakes poor decision making and every time we seem to have turned a corner we go and shoot ourselves in the foot.

Even accounting for the recent weather break, so much has happened since that late summer's day. Our squad has a completely different look to it nowadays and we had our first chance to see our new look squad in action on Saturday at home to Caldecote for our first match at The Carlsberg since October ! Again it was a closely fought contest that could have easily gone either way and on reflection a draw was a fair result. The visitors Goalkeeper Luke Kately was immense for them a made several top class saves to thwart our attempts to win three points. On our side it was good to see very impressive debuts from Dan Page, Jamie Thomas, Jermaine Mitchell, Brad O'Donovan and subs Johnny Monero and Jason Lynch.

We now need to start accumulating some points as we try to climb the table and gain some respectability. We have already thrown away too many points to gain promotion, but we should at least be aiming for a Top four or five finish and to have a good run in The Britannia Cup also.

As well as the new players, another important acquisition for myself is Andy 'Benny' Butterwick coming to join us as Club Coach. 'Benny' has previously been Reserve Team Manager at UCL club Eynesbury Rovers for several years and his experience and local knowledge will be vital as we plan for the future. Since Tony Armitage left we have had several people express an interest in the position but without really finalising anything and from my own point of view Managing a team at this level successfully on your own is a big ask.

It's always better to have someone to help out with the warm-ups, bounce ideas off and even tell if you are making a good call or a bad one ! I am sure you will join me in giving Benny a warm welcome to the club.

Action Round-Up from Saturday 6th March 2010

Oakley Sports were to maintain their quest for their first ever Premier Division league title by netting a 6-1 home win over AFC Kempston Town. Ashley Banks setting them on the way with the opening strike, but by half-time Scott Tallentire had levelled matters up for The Town. The second half however was to belong with the home side, Stuart Kelly having played the opening half in goal after Ricky Holmes had been taken ill before kick off scoring a hat-trick, Holmes having watched from the bench feeling well enough to go between the posts for the second period, James Cooper weighed in with the other two goals.

Wilshamstead meantime were taking their unbeaten ways to six games with a 3-0 home victory over Renhold United. Michael Jones netting first after 20 minutes before Paul Jones made it 2-0 just 15 minutes later, the points then finally sealed with a third goal from Colin Marshall on the hour mark.

Southill Alexander now find themselves without a win in their last nine outings after Dunton ended their own 11 games without a win run with a 3-2 victory at The Carlsberg Stadium. John Lynch shooting the home side in front just 15 minutes into the contest only to see a Lawrence Boshier penalty level matters on the half-hour mark. A Danny Carmels own goal then restored the lead for the home side until goals from Barry Morris on 65 minutes and Tom McGhee 10 minutes from time won the day for Dunton.

Britannia Cup

Current holders Caldecote safely made their way into the Semi-Final of this seasons competition and a trip to either Biggleswade United Reserves or Westoning Recreation Club with a 3-0 win at Campton. The opening goal coming after 14 minutes when Gareth Boness headed home on the backpost after meeting a pinpointed cross from Dave Daniels and just six minutes later Boness doubled the scoreline when a clever chip from Mark Phillips found him hugging the same back post to nudge home his second goal of the afternoon. The royal seal of approval then arrived 10 minutes from time when Jack Aris opened the way for Phillips to score goal number three.

In a First Round tie, Blunham needed to come from behind with two late goals to secure a 3-2 win at Sharnbrook. Michael Hutton giving Blunham the lead after just 10 minutes but when Darren Minney levelled matters five minutes into the second period and Lawrence Bentham put Sharnbrook 2-1 up on the hour mark a shock looked on the cards. However Andy Smith was to level matters 15 minutes from time via the penalty spot before netting the winner just five minutes later. Blunham will now face a home tie against Woburn in Round Two for the right to visit Southill Alexander at the Semi-Final stage.
